SUBJECT: Nomination to the Health Technology Assessment Council (HTAC)

Subcommittee on Preventive and Promotive Health

The Department of Health (DOH) created the Health Technology Assessment Council (HTAC) on 11 October 2021 to efficiently and effectively implement the Republic Act 11223 or the Universal Health Care Act. It is composed of a Core Committee composed of voting members, and seven (7) Subcommittees. Since its creation, the HTAC has accomplished its mandates as stipulated in Administrative Order 2021-0041 or the Implementing Guidelines on HTA which was signed by the Secretary of Health on 08 September 2020: (1) facilitate provision of financing and/or coverage recommendations on health technologies to be financed by DOH and Philhealth; (2) oversee and coordinate the HTA process within DOH and PhilHealth; and (3) review and assess existing DOH and PhilHealth benefit packages.

The HTAC has been informing government procurement decisions through its recommendations on COVID-19 technologies, urgent DOH National Program topics and other minor inclusion requests for drugs and vaccines already listed in the Philippine National Formulary. The HTAC generally has a two-year term, but we have yet to open the call for the next pool of experts due to a shift in priorities in light of the pandemic.

One of the members of the HTAC Subcommittee (SC) on Preventive and Promotive Health Services, however, will be leaving their post effective 31 October 2021. In line with this, the DOH is starting the call for nominations to the SC on Preventive and Promotive Health with the following functions:

• Exercise control over the expected quality, quantity, and timeliness of the HTA reports to be submitted to the Core Committee;

Consider the submissions of the industry, assessment teams, inputs from experts and patients for the preliminary recommendations to the Core Committee;

Evaluate the compliance of the assessment teams, with the agreed methodological standards in conducting assessments; and

Review and endorse the initial appraisal report to the HTA Core Committee for final discussion and recommendation.

Given the crucial role of the Council in evidence-based recommendations, the following are the qualifications of the HTAC members:

- Person of moral and intellectual integrity;
- A recognized specialist in their respective field of expertise;
- With at least 3 years experience in evidence appraisal; and,
- Willingness to disclose conflicts of interest.

Relative thereto, we are kindly requesting your good Office for nominees to the said position. We hope to receive the names and contact details of your nominees on or before 05 November 2021, and we shall reach out to them on the requirements and how to proceed with the application.
